1. Call to Order:

President Scott Ward called the meeting to order at 9:02 a.m.

2. Administer Oath of Office to Newly Appointed Board Member

Molly Jacobsen, Director of Administrative Services, administered the Oath of Office to newly appointed board member Dan Luckett.

3. Discuss and Consider Appointment of Officers for 2022.

Member Stan McKee made a motion recommending that Scott Ward continue serving as President of the Board for 2022; Cece Gassner remain Vice President; and Michael Glas remain as the Secretary/Treasurer. Mandy Freeman seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

4. Discuss and Consider Action Regarding Signatories and Authorization for all Commerce Economic Development Corporation Bank Accounts.

The three officers of the EDC Board: President Scott Ward, Vice President Cece Gassner, and Secretary/Treasurer Michael Glas will remain signatories for all bank accounts of the Commerce Economic Development Corporation.

Executive Director Bonnie Hunter will also remain as a signatory for all Commerce Economic Development Corporation bank accounts, with a \$10,000.00 signature limit on check transactions with her signature. No formal action is necessary, as this is currently how signatories for EDC accounts operate.

5. Consider Approval of the Minutes of the Regular Meeting on November 29, 2021.

Vice President Cece Gassner made a motion to approve the minutes of the regular meeting on November 29, 2021. Seconded by Stan McKee, the motion carried unanimously.

6. Discuss and consider Approval of the Financial Reports Ending November 30 and December 31, 2021.

Executive Director Bonnie Hunter summarized the EDC financials for November, with the Reserve Account at \$1.1 million; Cash/Checking account with a balance of \$1.7 million; and the USDA Revolving Loan with just under \$63,000.

December financials reflected the following: \$1.4 million in Reserves; \$1.8 million in the Cash/Checking Account; and the USDA Revolving Loan had a balance of approximately \$63,600.

Vice President Cece Gassner moved to approve the financial reports for November and December as presented. Seconded by Joe Shipman, the motion carried unanimously.

7. Discuss and Consider Possible Action Regarding a Rail Spur Track.

Gramazini Stone had expressed interest in a potential rail spur track for their facility. Executive Director Bonnie Hunter stated that Gramazini Stone is finalizing the purchase of two U.S. quarries, with plans to start bringing product in from California, Virginia, Alabama, and Georgia. Given the quantity, weight, and transportation costs, they have determined that rail is the best option. Various meetings have taken place with Freedom Rail Group, NETC, Gramazini and the CEDC regarding a temporary location to offload product and plans for the construction of a spur track to support the company's needs. A very rough estimate by Freedom Rail was \$600-800 per foot to build the spur, with an additional cost of \$150,000 for the hand switch. Freedom Rail will get hard costs and get back to everyone.

Cece Gassner suggested the EDC hold off for more specific numbers before making any decision. No action taken.

8. Comments and Reports

- a. Citizens' Comments [Citizens will be allotted three (3) minutes to comment or speak to the board.] No one came forward.
- b. City Manager Howdy Lisenbee stated that the City Council had approved a Chapter 380 Agreement with Bloomfield Homes. They will participate in absorbing the cost of new sewer and water infrastructure. When Bloomfield Homes buys materials for building homes and that transaction yields sales tax, Commerce will get the sales tax, regardless of where the materials are purchased. Bloomfield Homes asked that the city give 50% of the sales tax back to them. Manager Lisenbee told Bloomfield the EDC could

not participate in an agreement of this sort, and an agreement was reached between Bloomfield and the City. The EDC will keep its usual ½ cent of the sales tax, and the city would split its portion of the sales tax revenue with Bloomfield Homes. The EDC should expect to receive around \$100,000 from this agreement.

- c. Legal Counsel Nothing to report.
- **d.** Ex-Officio Member(s) Molly Jacobsen reported that the General Election for the Mayor's seat will be held on May 7, 2022. Incumbent Mayor Williams will not be running for re-election. The filing period for Mayor runs through February 18.
- e. Board Members Cece Gassner summarized that a \$45 million agricultural complex will be constructed at the site of the old president's house on Highway 24. Construction is anticipated to begin near the end of 2022 and continue through 2025. This complex should bring more businesses to Commerce.
- **f.** Executive Director Bonnie Hunter announced a Job Fair for Tuesday, February 8 from 10 am to 2 pm here at City Hall. Participating industries include: Gramazini, Huaru Pipe, Hydro Aluminum and Nexii.

Director Hunter will attend the TEDC Winter Conference in Sugar Land February 16-18.

Hunt County Commissioners Court will be meeting to discuss various tax abatements for Huaru, Zurn and Nexus-2 on February 22 at 10:00 a.m.

The grand opening of NEXUS-1 in Hazelton, PA is set for Wednesday, March 30. Director Hunter and City Manager Lisenbee plan to attend.

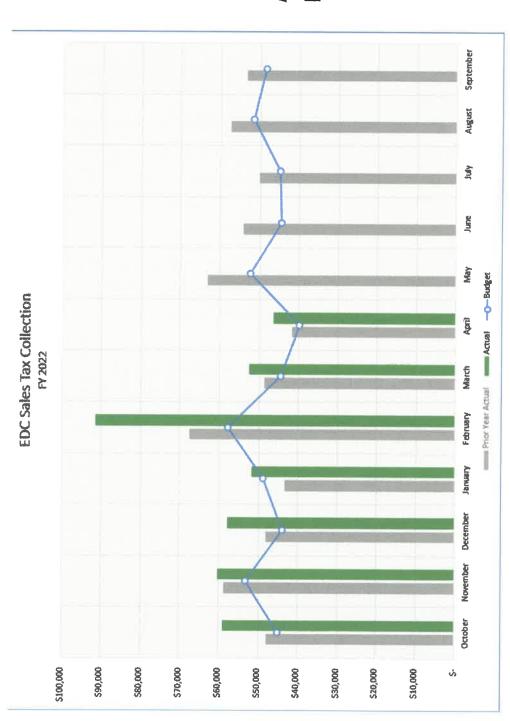
